



## Community Health Workers (CHW) - Explanation of Eligibility

For the Caring4Cal program, only Community Health Workers listed below and working in a home setting only qualify as holding eligible job roles. To qualify, you **must** have one of the titles listed in the table below.

Community Health Worker (CHW) is a very specific type of job and only specific titles are considered that job type. Simply being a health worker and working in the community does not mean that a person is a CHW. (For example, a direct care worker with the title Caregiver who works in the community is NOT considered a CHW). Being considered a CHW depends on having one of the exact titles listed below. The CHW's supervisor must also sign off that their title matches exactly, as would appear on their job description, official company paperwork, and so on.

For CHWs volunteering, their volunteer work must be in the very specific role of CHW, and their volunteer position title has to match one of those on the EVF, with their supervisor certifying the title, exactly the same as if they were paid.
